On behalf of Christian Vision (CVI), in association with T-Systems and other sponsors, I am delighted to invite you to the B07 HFCC/ASBU meeting in the UK.

The meeting will be held from Monday 27th- Friday 31st August 2007 at the Hilton Metropole NEC Hotel, Birmingham.

Birmingham is the second largest city in UK, situated in the heart of England. The NEC (National Exhibition Centre) is adjacent to Birmingham International Airport, about 10km east of the city centre.

Birmingham International Airport (BHX) has direct flights to numerous cities in Europe including major hubs such as Amsterdam and Paris. A number of Asian and Middle Eastern Airlines also serve the airport, along with one US carrier.

The NEC and Airport are served by 'Birmingham International' train station, with direct trains from London every 30 minutes taking just under an hour and a half. Frequent trains to the centre of Birmingham take 10-20 minutes. The hotel operates a complimentary shuttle bus service between the airport, train station and hotel. The hotel is 10 minutes' walking distance from the airport and train station.

A Conference fee of £70 is payable in cash at Conference Registration on Sunday 26th August.

Christian Vision is planning an optional tour of local tourist attractions Warwick Castle and Stratford-upon-Avon on the afternoon of Friday 31st August. Participants are requested to cover the cost of this trip in cash, to be collected during the Conference.

Monday 27th August is a UK public holiday. This will impose slight limitations on transport and opening hours of some public facilities; private businesses are closed on that day. The business of the HFCC/ASBU conference should not be affected in any way, and the city centre and transport links will still operate for leisure, dining and entertainment.

Please continue to check the HFCC website for updates on useful information such as visa requirements as the HFCC/ASBU meeting draws closer.
